• Full time, one-year placements within CDC offices worldwide

- Minimum Requirements
  - Master's degree or PhD in Public Health from a CEPH accredited school or program
  - Recent graduate must receive Masters or Doctorate degree prior to beginning of fellowship or within the last five years
  - U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident and authorized to work in the U.S.
- **Guidance from leading experts** within CDC's Center for Global Health
- Access to training and professional development advice and resources
- Stipends for 2018-2019 placements are \$48,109 (Master's level) and \$53,137 (Doctoral level)
- Predetermined supplemental allowances for housing, local travel, travel/training, and health
- Overseas fellows receive a **one time shipping** allowance
