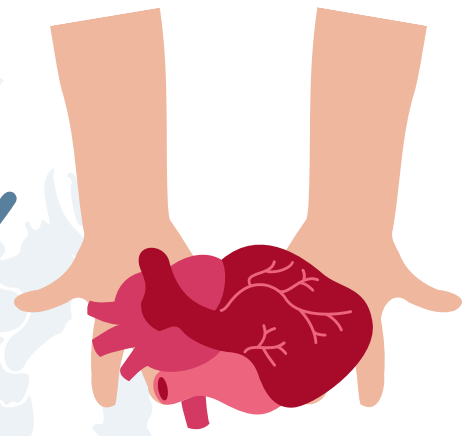


WORLD HEPATITIS DAY JULY 28, 2026



World Hepatitis Day, observed on July 28, highlights the importance of preventing, testing for, and treating viral hepatitis. Millions of people worldwide are living with hepatitis B or hepatitis C, often without knowing it. Public health professionals play a vital role in reducing hepatitis through education, screening, vaccination, harm reduction, and efforts to improve access to care and reduce stigma.

- ASSISTING AT COMMUNITY HEALTH FAIRS AND OUTREACH EVENTS
- SUPPORTING ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE HARM REDUCTION SERVICES
- VOLUNTEERING WITH COMMUNITY-BASED HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS SERVING VULNERABLE POPULATIONS
- PARTICIPATING IN PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATION AND AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS
- DONATING TIME TO PROGRAMS THAT SUPPORT INDIVIDUALS AFFECTED BY SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS, HOMELESSNESS, OR OTHER SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH ASSOCIATED WITH INCREASED HEPATITIS RISK
